

PPiP2 updates

This first SINAPPS milestone deadline is updated to end of June and we have only four weeks to achieve it. The recruitment in PPiP2 has been struggling over the past couple of months, but we still have chance to increase recruitment figures before the next milestone. Historical low recruitment in PPiP2 severely impacted on SINAPPS2 figures too, and while March has been a great month for PPiP2, there is still a lot to do to cover for previous months of low recruitment.

It is now more vital than ever that over the next few weeks we invest on PPiP2 and recruit as many participants as we can. Let's do it!

SINAPPS2 updates

As we mentioned in the past issue, we randomized three more SINAPPS2 participants in April. This was possible because of the good recruitment in PPiP2 in March and the first half of April.

Two of these SINAPPS2 participants have already received part of the trial treatment at our Oxford site, while the third will begin the IVIG/placebo infusions next week.

Recruitment of three more SINAPPS2 participants in one month was possible because of successful PPiP2 recruitment in the previus month. Thank you PPIP2 sites for making this possible. Let's keep the momentum going!
